COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Advanced Persian Conversation course is designed to strengthen students' oral proficiency through intensive practice with authentic materials. The course emphasizes fluency, accuracy, and the ability to express complex ideas across a wide range of abstract topics. Students engage with authentic audio and video materials, Persian media sources, interviews, and excerpts from contemporary cultural and political discussions.

Class sessions focus on expanding students' active vocabulary, improving pronunciation and intonation, and developing the ability to sustain extended discourse in formal and informal settings. Students participate in debates, problem solving tasks, role plays, spontaneous speaking activities, and thematic discussions on social, political, cultural, and economic issues relevant to Iran and the Persian speaking world.

The course also aims to enrich learners' cultural understanding of Iran and other Persian speaking regions.

OBJECTIVE

Upon the completion of this course, student shall be able to:

- Speak with greater accuracy and use culturally appropriate formal and informal registers.
- Discuss a range of concrete as well as abstract topics with confidence.
- Expand and actively use an enriched vocabulary.
- Improve their listening comprehension skills through exposure to authentic materials.
- Recognize, understand, and incorporate cultural references in conversation.
- Produce extended, coherent discourse on a variety of themes.

MATERIALS

Students are placed in small groups or individualized tutorials for class, based on proficiency level. Textbooks and course materials will be based according to group.

Content of classes will be complemented through the usage of adequate literature, literary texts, and books that will be prepared by the instructor with instructions given by the instructor and will include creative exercises and usage of appropriate media such as video, music, movies, theater etc.

COURSE POLICIES

Attendance Policy:

It is essential that students attend classes and keep up with course work on a daily basis, since the development of speaking skills requires active preparation and participation. Moreover, students who come to class unprepared fall behind and hold up the rest of the class. For this reason, attendance is mandatory: Repeated or extreme tardiness may also be counted as unexcused absence.

Missed homework assignments will also lower your final grade. Homework must be submitted on the day that it is due and will be returned to students on the following day (late work will be accepted only by arrangement with the instructor).

GRADING AND ASSESSMENT

Class attendance is a critical part of progress in language and students are expected to come on time and prepared for each class.

Individual student work includes reading of assigned literary works, historical, current and interesting texts, daily newspapers; working on spelling and grammar exercises, as well as homework and linguistic exercises assigned by the professor; essay writing, student creating and keeping up with their own pocket dictionaries based upon vocabulary learned in class.
